Information Sheet on the Chaplain Corps Journal (updated 18 September 2014)

The Chaplain Corps Journal (CCJ) was re-activated under its new name in June 2014. The CCJ operates under the auspices of the Office of the Chief of Chaplains and the US Army Chaplain Center and School. The Commandant of USACHCS approves the release of the CCJ. The Managing Editor is the Deputy Commandant. The Senior Editor is appointed by the Commandant of USACHCS. The Senior Editor is assisted by an Army CIV employee who serves as the Editor. There is an Editorial Board of Review that reads and recommends articles for publication according to a published peer-review process.

Here are some features of the Journal:

- The Chaplain Corps Journal is a bi-annual, peer-reviewed professional journal that provides a respectful, academically-rigorous forum for theological reflection, doctrinal discussion, personal encouragement and challenge, and the reviews of books – particularly those that call our Chaplain Corps to think critically and reflectively about the religious support we provide to Soldiers and their Families.
- The new CCJ published its first issue in July 2014 and is part of the professional journal family at Command and Research Library, CGSC, at Fort Leavenworth
